Introduction

ISF Gymnasiade – School Summer Games is a multisport event characterized by a balanced program between sport and educational content: to create awareness about the role of sport in putting forward topics such as fair play, healthy lifestyle, respect and inclusion. The Gymnasiade is individual and team competition both. Beside the sport programme, special emphasis will be given in educational and cultural topics for all the participants.

The ISF School Summer Games is organised every 2 years during even-numbered years.

This 18th ISF Gymnasiade (School Summer Games) -Jinjiang 2020 will host 18 sports (see technical details), with 5 of them being new to the programme:

Travelling and Visa

Ports of Entry

The followings are the official ports of entry:

- Quanzhou Jinjiang International Airport
- Xiamen Gaoqi International Airport
- Xiamenbei Railway Station
- Quanzhou Railway Station
- Jinjiang Railway Station

Travelling

Travel to the official ports of entry is to be arranged and financed by each participating delegation. Delegations are to arrive on November 26, 2022 and depart on December 3, 2022 after breakfast. The organisation of an extended stay for the delegation (before or after the event) is a matter of the delegation concerned. It shall not be the responsibility of the Local Organising Committee. When the distance between the host city and the capital of a participating delegation on another continent exceeds 5000km, the delegation may extend its stay by arriving one day earlier (November 25, 2022) and/or leaving one day later (December 4, 2022) at the standard daily fee.

VISA

Each participating delegation is required to check whether a visa is needed to enter P.R. China. Please contact the related Embassy or Consulate to consult visa application procedure.

Insurance

Each participating delegation is required to provide insurance for each member of its delegation. At a minimum the insurance is to cover civil liability, material damage and medical costs.

Medical care

Medical care plans will be formulated to ensure the medical and health safety of relevant personnel.

Measures Related to Covid-19

We will carry out relevant work against COVID-19 in accordance with the joint prevention and control policies of the National Health Commission. Special contingency plans will be tailored for the Gymnasiade. You may refer to the official websites of the National Health Commission of the People's Republic of China (<http://www.nhc.gov.cn/>) and Fujian Provincial Health Commission (<http://wjw.fujian.gov.cn/xxgk/gzdt/wsjsyw/>) for the epidemic updates.

Flight Fare Discount

All official delegation participants have the right to an 80% flight fare discount on all international flights of Xiamen Airlines to and from Quanzhou Jinjiang International Airport and Xiamen Gaoqi International Airport. Flight prices are based on the freight rates announced by Xiamen Airlines Co., Ltd, i.e. the full economy class fare excluding taxes and fees and only during the event and for Xiamen Airlines.

All queries related to flight fare discount to be sent to the LOC : airtickets@jinjiang2020.cn

Procedures concerning the purchase of discount flight tickets are as follows:

1. Official delegation participants shall provide the LOC with full information including countries or regions of the delegations, names, ID (passport) scanning copy, intended flight number (including date, take-off and landing city and time) and other information.
2. Once the LOC validates and confirms the delegations qualified for 80% discount, eligible delegations shall transfer 20% of the corresponding flight fare based on the freight rates announced by Xiamen Airlines along with the relevant taxes and fees which will be settled in RMB, to the bank account (which will be announced duly) set up by the LOC dedicated for air tickets settlement and send the remittance receipt to the LOC via email. Failure to pay the flight fare and the relevant taxes and fees in time will be deemed as an automatic waiver of rights to the 80% discount and those delegations shall purchase flight tickets on their own.
3. The LOC will provide Xiamen Airlines with the information required for them to issue tickets after confirming the eligibility of delegations to flight fare discount and receiving 20% of the announced freight rates along with related taxes and fees. Then the LOC will send the information of the booked tickets to the delegations. Tickets can't be refunded or changed once they are issued.

More information and deadlines on the procedure of purchasing discount flight tickets will be duly announced to the ISF member.

Composition of Delegation

Each delegation shall consist of:

1. Head of delegation - *mandatory*;
2. Deputy head of delegation - *optional*;
3. Student athlete(s) - *mandatory*;
4. Team official(s) - *mandatory*;
5. Field of Play Officials (referees/umpires/judges) - *optional*;
6. Additional adults - *optional*;

Head of delegation

There is a mandatory amount of one (1) head of delegation per registering delegation.

- The head of delegation shall be the sole intermediary between the delegation and the Local Organising Committee, the ISF Technical Commission and the ISF Delegate.
- He/she may not combine the function with any other official role (i.e., coach, referee, etc.).

Deputy head of delegation

Bigger delegation can register min. 0 / max 2 deputy heads of delegation, that have the rights and duties of the head of delegation when he/she is absent/busy. The deputy head of delegation is optional and can only be registered when the delegation consists of 50 or more participants:

- from 0 to 49 participants = 0 deputy head of delegation
- from 50 to 100 participants = 1 deputy head of delegation
- from 101 to 427 participants = 2 deputy heads of delegation

Student athletes

- All student athletes must be attending schools which provide a general education and/or vocational education incorporating segments of general education.
- The following are *not* eligible to participate:
 - Attendees of vocational schools who only attend a school as a complement to their vocational training and are not full-time students with segment of general education.
 - Students enrolled at schools which provide sports training without any general education.
 - Part-time (e.g. afternoon) sports schools which take pupils from a variety of schools for training in one or more sports.

Team officials (Coaches and Other Team Officials)

Coaches

- The coach shall train/direct student athletes in the competition.

Other Team Officials

- The function of each other team officials must be specified during the registration process (Doctor, Physiotherapist, Trainer, Statistician, Team manager etc.).

Field of play officials - FOPA (judges, referees, umpires)

Depending on the sport and on the number of athletes entered, the LOC requests the registering delegation to provide one (1) or more FOPAs. In accordance with ISF rules, failure to provide the required number of Field of play officials (referees, judges, umpires) will lead to a fine of 900 EUR per referee payable to the organiser till the end of the registration phase 3 (August 31, 2022) at the latest.

All Field of play officials shall be in possession of international qualification. Delegations must provide certificates for Field of play officials during the registration process. National level qualifications will not be accepted. The referees cannot combine their position with other positions, such as head of delegation, team officials or additional adults.

Additional adults

The function of each additional adult must be specified during the registration process (interpreter, security personnel, ministry representative, media, etc.).

Delegations can register up to fifteen (15) additional adults.

- from 1 to 30 athletes = 1 additional adult
- from 31 to 60 athletes = 2 additional adults
- from 61 to 90 athletes = 3 additional adults
- from 91 to 120 athletes = 4 additional adults
- from 121 to 150 athletes = 5 additional adults
- from 151 to 180 athletes = 6 additional adults
- from 181 to 210 athletes = 7 additional adults
- from 211 to 240 athletes = 8 additional adults
- from 241 to 270 athletes = 9 additional adults
- from 271 to 300 athletes = 10 additional adults
- from 301 to 330 athletes = 11 additional adults
- from 331 to 360 athletes = 12 additional adults
- from 361 to 390 athletes = 13 additional adults
- from 391 to 400 athletes = 14 additional adults
- from 401 to 427 athletes = 15 additional adults

Any other person not specified during registration or exceeding the quotas specified in this document will not be considered part of the official delegation and will not be accredited by the LOC.

The following team format is accepted:

- All referees have to be FIBA International licensed.
- A tournament with 8 teams per category will be formed.
- The teams for the tournament will be selected by ISF

*Failure to provide the required number of Field of play officials (referees, judges, umpires) will lead to a fine of 900 EUR per referee payable to the organiser.

Disciplinary Decisions

Event Disciplinary Commission

In accordance with the ISF General Competition Rules, the ISF Event Disciplinary Commission shall deal with all incidents and all violations of the ISF Statutes, Sport Policy, ISF Handbook, Rules, and any other ISF document linked to the ISF events and broadly with misbehaviours not directly related to the sport technical regulation during an ISF event.

The Event Disciplinary Commission is composed of the ISF Delegate, the Sport Committee Chair, and LOC Delegate.

Appeal Jury

The Appeal Jury shall deal with all protests of a technical sporting nature during the competition. The Appeal Jury is formed for all sports in the event.

The Appeal Jury is composed of the President of the Technical Commission, one member of the Local Organising Committee, and the Head Field of Play Officials.

Appeals

Please refer to the Appeal section of the Technical Rules and Regulations for the appeal for each relevant sport

Participants Obligations

- Each participant is required to be present throughout the whole duration of the event.
- Each participant is obliged to take part in all the non-sport activities.
- Each team undertakes to compete against all other participating teams.
- Each participant undertakes to compete against all other participants.
- The absence of any member of a participating team from any part of the entire sport, opening, prize-giving and closing ceremonies and socio-cultural programme may result in the team being excluded from the final results.

Anti-Doping

ISF being a Wada code signatory is promoting clean sport as one of the main values applied during its events. Besides the tests that can take place accordingly to the age category and the tradition of relevant sports, ISF in cooperation with WADA is implementing a large educational programme to raise awareness on the danger of doping behaviours.

EduC Program

Nation Night

The Nation Night encourage exchanges between the different cultures of the participating countries - any presentations / performances done by the students that countries may wish to present.

Delegations are free to bring a video, music, dance, song presentation, etc. as long as they inform the LOC in advance. The length of the presentation/performance shall be of 5-10 minutes max.

The videos, music, CD USB sticks should be handed to the LOC during accreditation.

Cultural Program

Cultural Activities

The aim of cultural activities is to provide deep insights into traditional Chinese culture and folk customs in Southern Fujian and to promote exchanges and friendship among participants from various countries (regions).

Fun & Skill Zone

The aim of Fun & Skill Zone is to raise the interest of youth in exploring life. A "Fun and Interactive Carnival" will be held. Exhibition areas will be set up for various sports, anti-doping, inclusive health education and the dissemination of environmental knowledge and for delegations to present their cultures, so as to promote concepts such as gender equality, solidarity and friendliness, fair play.

Conference

Domestic and international decision makers and scholars, ISF officials, young leaders and students will be invited to the conference to exchange ideas on the impact of School Sport from local to international levels, so as to deepen the understanding of themes related to education, culture and sport. The format will consist of a main session bringing together the highest authorities to present the key themes and two other sessions presenting the sub-themes.

Sport Clinics

Sport Clinics will be organized on relevant sports of the event, so as to provide an opportunity for athletes and officials to upgrade their knowledge and share best sport practices.

General Information

Travelling to Jinjiang, China

- General information on country :

The 18th ISF Gymnasiade will be held in Jinjiang Fujian China. Jinjiang as the host is located on the southeastern coast of China at 24°30'N-24°54'N, 118°24'E-118°43'E. As one of the most important cities at the starting point of the ancient Maritime Silk Road, Jinjiang enjoys a long and profound history that has witnessed the emergence of many outstanding people. With one of the most prosperous private economy in the country, Jinjiang is home to a great number of well-known sporting goods companies and it boasts a developed sports industry, which in turn contributes to the dynamic and enthusiastic sporting atmosphere among the citizens. Over 2000 sporting events for the general public are held every year. Sports such as basketball, volleyball, football and swimming enjoy huge popularity across society. Over recent years, Jinjiang has held dozens of international sporting events including those of beach volleyball, basketball and marathons, thus accumulating rich experience in holding large-scale sporting events.

- Resident population: 2.06 million
- Language: Mandarin, Southern Min dialect
- Climate: Jinjiang has a subtropical monsoon littoral climate featuring influences from well-developed monsoon winds and four distinctive seasons characterized by hot summers and warm winters. The annual average temperature is 17-22°C.
